

A Message from Father Mark

This weekend my bulletin article will focus upon “How we the gifted can share our precious gifts with those who will be our future.” In my last article, we mentioned that St. Veronica Parish would like to establish an endowment fund to help stabilize finances and help to alleviate out of pocket costs.

We recognize that the needs are great in our parish. From helping the poor through the Food Pantry and Thrift Shop to offering Christian Formation through Youth Ministry and elementary Religious Education classes. The maintenance needs of our aging buildings are astronomical. For example, the roofs on the church, school and office buildings will need replacement, improvements are needed in the lighting and sound quality of our church, the cooling system as well as the existing boiler for the church and school will need replacement. All of these necessary items continue to rise in cost and remain a burden for our parish to maintain. With the establishment of an endowment, we as a parish could be preparing to meet the rising cost and actually keep the out of pocket costs at a minimum. This takes planning. Remember the man who was entrusted with the five talents, he made five more talents. The master commended him for being insightful and thrifty. We as a parish need to take the same attitude towards our future. Someone asked me, “What guarantee do we have that the parish will remain open?” There is no guarantee, but that attitude only establishes the motive for the man who buried his talent in the ground and lost it due to fear. To remain fearful about the future will only guarantee future financial burdens that appear to be impossible to overcome.

Judith Schenk, a parish member, would like to share her insights as a financial planner and Stewardship Committee member about future planning in regards to endowments and charitable gifting. Judith takes a very practical approach to what is so necessary in our daily lives. We need to always think of our future and how we will keep ourselves stable and financially secure. Judith would like to offer a program called “Building a Long-Term Investment Strategy.” This strategy is vital for you as parishioners and our parish future. Judith will offer opportunities to meet following the Masses to allow you to ask questions in regards to what you have done for your family but also what you have done for our parish. That is right, for our future as a parish. How we plan for our families affects how we plan as a parish. Remember what I said about offering a gift? What we offer to God should be thoughtful not an afterthought. When we give a gift to someone we love, we take time and carefully chose the right gift. If we respond by taking time to strategize we are offering to God a thoughtful gift, one that will continue to bless to our community.

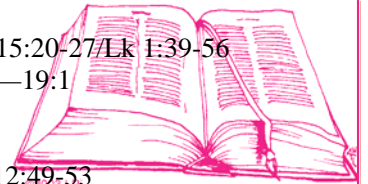

The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary into Heaven

On this day the church commemorates the bodily entry of Mary into heaven. Eastern traditions refer to this as the Dormition of the Virgin; that is, the “sleeping” of Mary. Pope Pius XII declared the Assumption a the dogma of the Church in 1950. The meaning of this solemnity can be found in the preface of the Eucharistic Prayer assigned to it: “Today the virgin Mother of God was taken up into heaven to be the beginning and the pattern of the Church in its perfection.” *Sourcebook, 2007*
