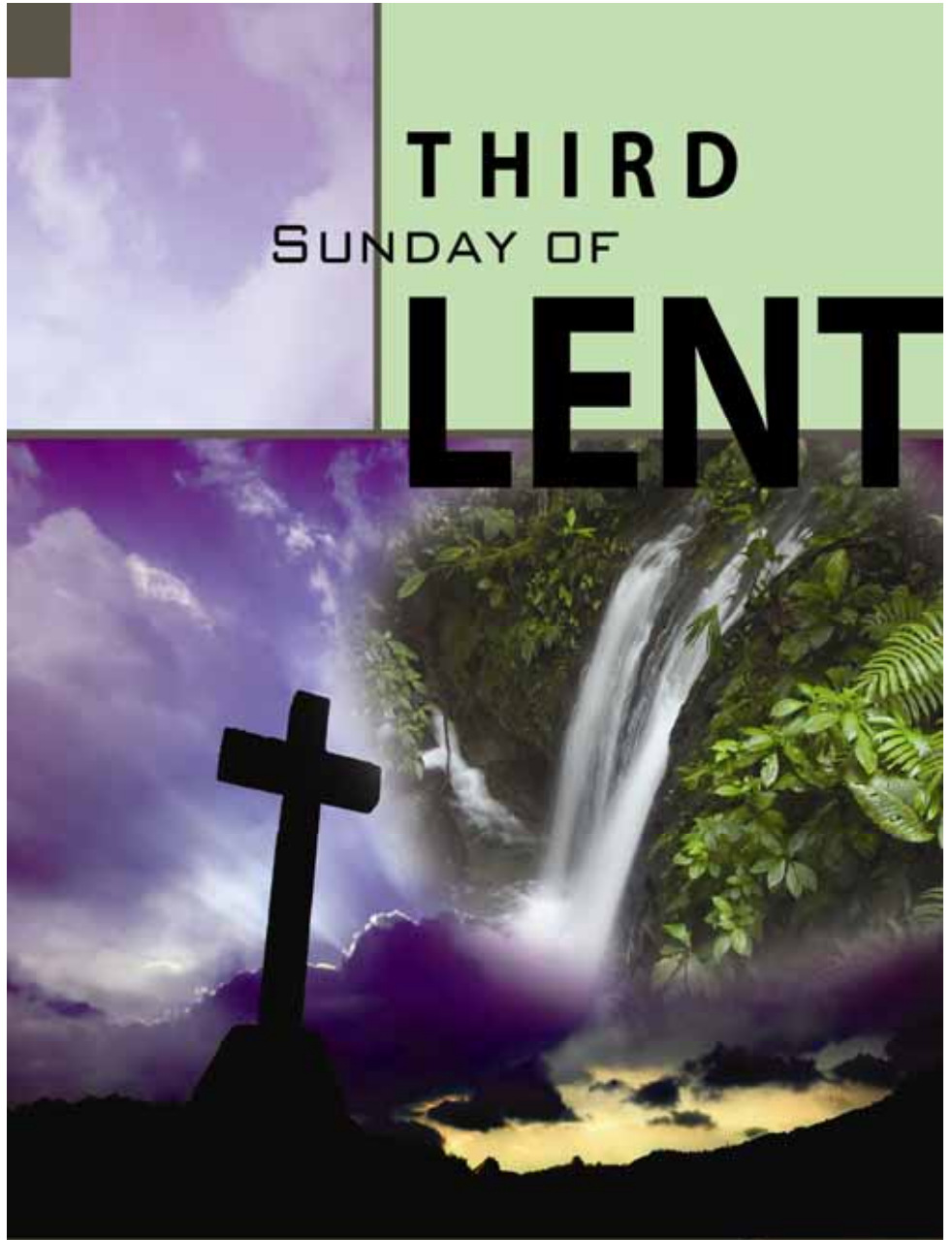

"...WHERE THEN CAN YOU GET THIS LIVING WATER?"  
John 4:11b



### A Message from Father Mark

In our Gospel this Sunday, water is the prevalent image. We use water daily; to cook, to clean, to bathe, and to drink. Water is so essential for life that a person will die within 3-4 days without it. In the United States we are very fortunate to have clean running water anytime we need or want it. There are places in which the people have to boil their water before drinking it or must walk for miles to find it.

Jesus asks the Samaritan woman for a drink. What appears on the surface to be a harmless request leads to a profound discussion about quenching a thirst. She questions Jesus defensively due to her own fear. She must have wondered: "Who is this? What does he want from me? Can't people simply leave me alone?" Jesus disarms her by recognizing her as a genuine person. She realizes that He is not out to hurt or shame her. Jesus brings to light a thirst that she has for life. It is a thirst that the woman didn't acknowledge until she probed within herself. Jesus offers the woman Living Water that will well up in her to eternal life. She discovers that she needs the Living Water Jesus is offering. Her thirst was to be accepted by those around her, especially the other women of her town. She previously had several husbands which made her an outcast, the brunt of gossip and rumors. She was at the well by herself; possibly avoiding others.

Jesus' words bring forth truth that sets her free from her past. This freedom awakens newness to life. Deep within the woman is a faith that is welling up and spilling out upon those around her. She spreads the news about Jesus. She believes what she is sharing. The other townspeople came to believe not only because of her words but those of Jesus.

What do we thirst for in our lives? Like the Samaritan women, we may seek forgiveness, acceptance and truth. Like the woman we might live in fear; defensive about what others may think of us or what others may be saying about us. Jesus offers to us the same Living Water so that we may face what is deep within ourselves. During this Lenten season we need to examine issues and situations that have been left unresolved. Let your thirst be quenched by the words of Jesus allowing you to face your fears.

For some of us, the thought of going to confession may evoke the same fear that the Samaritan woman felt when she encountered Jesus. Worrying about what "Father Mark might think about me after I confess my sins" is a prime example of what the woman was experiencing. To face our past actions can be frightening. However, Jesus offered her healing and wholeness. Once the truth was out in the open the woman felt relief and joy. She experienced the waters of life welling up in her. Let the same healing be yours during this season.

We have a wonderful cluster Lenten series about the Letters of St. Paul which have so much to offer us. Our journey allows us to connect to the communities which he served and inspired. Please check the bulletin for further information for the topics, locations and times. *Blessings, Fr Mark*

### Theme: Jesus is the Living Water

Question for Children: *How do you experience Jesus helping and loving you?*

Question for Youth: *Jesus revealed himself to an outcast of society. How can you be "living water" to the outcasts of your school? Society? The world?*

Question for Adults: *When you are tempted to try to satisfy your "thirst for meaning" through some other means, what keeps you coming back to the living water of intimacy with Christ? Through what means do you experience Christ's power in your life: Sacraments? Scripture? Prayer? Others?*

Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and Eucharistic Adoration will take place THIS Sunday, FEBRUARY 24, during the time between the Masses. Jesus truly present in the Sacred Host will be exposed to view in the monstrance on the altar. Plan to spend some quiet prayer-time in adoration and thanksgiving after the 8:30 Mass or before the 10:30 Mass. This opportunity for prayer will be offered on **the Sunday that is in the fourth full weekend of the month.** *When you look at the Crucifix you see how much Jesus loved you then. When you look at the Sacred Host you see how much He loves you now.* (Blessed Mother Theresa of Calcutta) At 10:00 we will conclude with Benediction, the ceremony of praise and blessing.

## Week Three of Operation Rice Bowl-India

My name is Pailash, I am 14 years old, and I live in Calcutta India. When I was very young I got polio and the muscles in my legs were paralyzed, so I cannot walk. I am an orphan, and for many years I survived on the streets by selling newspapers. I only earned about 50 to 100 rupees a day (\$1.00 to \$2.50). I got very tired after the long day's work, and was always worried that someone would take my money while I slept.

One day a friend took me to a school here in Calcutta that is supported by Catholic Relief Services. Here at the school, I have finally found a safe place to call home, and I no longer worry about being hungry because I receive meals every day. My favorite subject is math and I play the bongos in our school orchestra. I like the drums because God gave me nice hands. My favorite song is "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands". Next year I will graduate from this school and transfer to an all boys' high school. There I will learn skills for a trade and then I will be able to find a job and earn a good living for myself.

## Adult Ministry

### Rite of Christian Initiation Corner

As a parish, we continue to pray for the Elect of God during Lent and the intense final preparations for reception into the Church. To help you get to know them better, we will be sharing a brief biography of each during the next few weeks.

Ron Lemcke (St. Veronica parishioner) Ron is a catechumen preparing for Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist. He was married to his wife and sponsor Susy in the Fall of 2007. Ron had been considering joining the church for the past 2 years. When asked for his reasons for joining the Catholic church, Ron explained, "*This completes my personal journey that I feel that I have been called to do. It's a commitment I made to my wife and I want to set an example for my children*". He also believes that once the process is complete it will make him more knowledgeable about his responsibilities as a practicing Catholic, a better husband and loving dad. Ron is being sponsored by Susy Lemcke and Thomas Bushman.

### Lenten Prayer Wall

This Liturgical season of Lent the Church asks you to be mindful to pray, fast and give alms. To enhance the prayers of our parish, the liturgy committee has created a prayer wall. The wall is reminiscent of the Wailing or Western Wall in Jerusalem. This stone structure is the only remaining portion of a retaining wall which had been built by Herod to surround the area of the Temple Mount. This area included the Second Temple which was rebuilt after the Jews returned from the Babylonian captivity. Many Jews come to the wall to pray, remember the temple that once existed and to write petitions and place them in the crevices.

The St. Veronica prayer wall gives you the opportunity to write petitions to God on small slips of paper. Roll up the paper and put it into a niche in the wall. The wall will be in the sanctuary for all of Lent. On Holy Saturday, the prayer slips will be removed from the wall and added to the Easter fire that is lit that night.

# Christian Formation

### Sharing Faith with Your Child

Each week, we offer parents a faith theme and how to weave it into ordinary family life. Ideas come from 52 Simple Ways to Talk with Your Kids about Faith by Jim Campbell. This week we consider "Relieving Your Child of Too Much Pressure." As parents, we can place burdens on our children to succeed at everything. We want them to become successful and happy adults, so we try to give them multiple opportunities. However, we can sometimes expect too much, beyond their natural capacity. Then the expectations are our own and not our child's. Teachable moments are report card or conference time, when they show an interest or lack of interest in an activity or while in the car traveling to or from an activity. Ask your child about his/her hopes and dreams for the future. Listen for signs that they desire to please you more than they enjoy the activity.

### Catholic Kids Corner

#### Elementary Religious Education

Children have returned to classes. We continue to collect food for the St. Paul parish St. Vincent de Paul. Next week we will begin collecting cleaning products for the St. Veronica food pantry. Students in grades 5 and 6 will be praying the Stations of the Cross after the 8:30 Mass.

In four hours the children will learn about the Passover and make unleavened bread, create a craft project, participate in a church

search, eat together and play bingo. It is an enjoyable learning experience. Please keep our children in your prayers as they prepare to receive their First Eucharist.

The next session of Children's Liturgy of the Word will be held during the 10:30am Mass on March 2. The prayer leaders will be Sharon and Brittany Lyda. This will be the only CLW during March due to the early date of Easter. All children ages 4-8 are invited to follow the prayer leaders into the Parents Room on the Norwich side of church. The children return to their parents during the Offertory.



### Fun Facts for Faithful Kids

Have you ever heard of a store called a five and dime? I'll bet your grandparents have.

On February 24, 1879

F.W. Woolworth opened his first store. Almost everything in the store was priced at 5¢ or 10¢. These stores carried almost anything you needed. Today, very few things cost this little, but remember that donating 5¢ or 10¢ from your allowance helps to support your parish.

One day, the police learned that a priest was secretly celebrating a Mass in her London home. St. Anne was arrested and convicted of protecting priests. She was hung in 1601.
