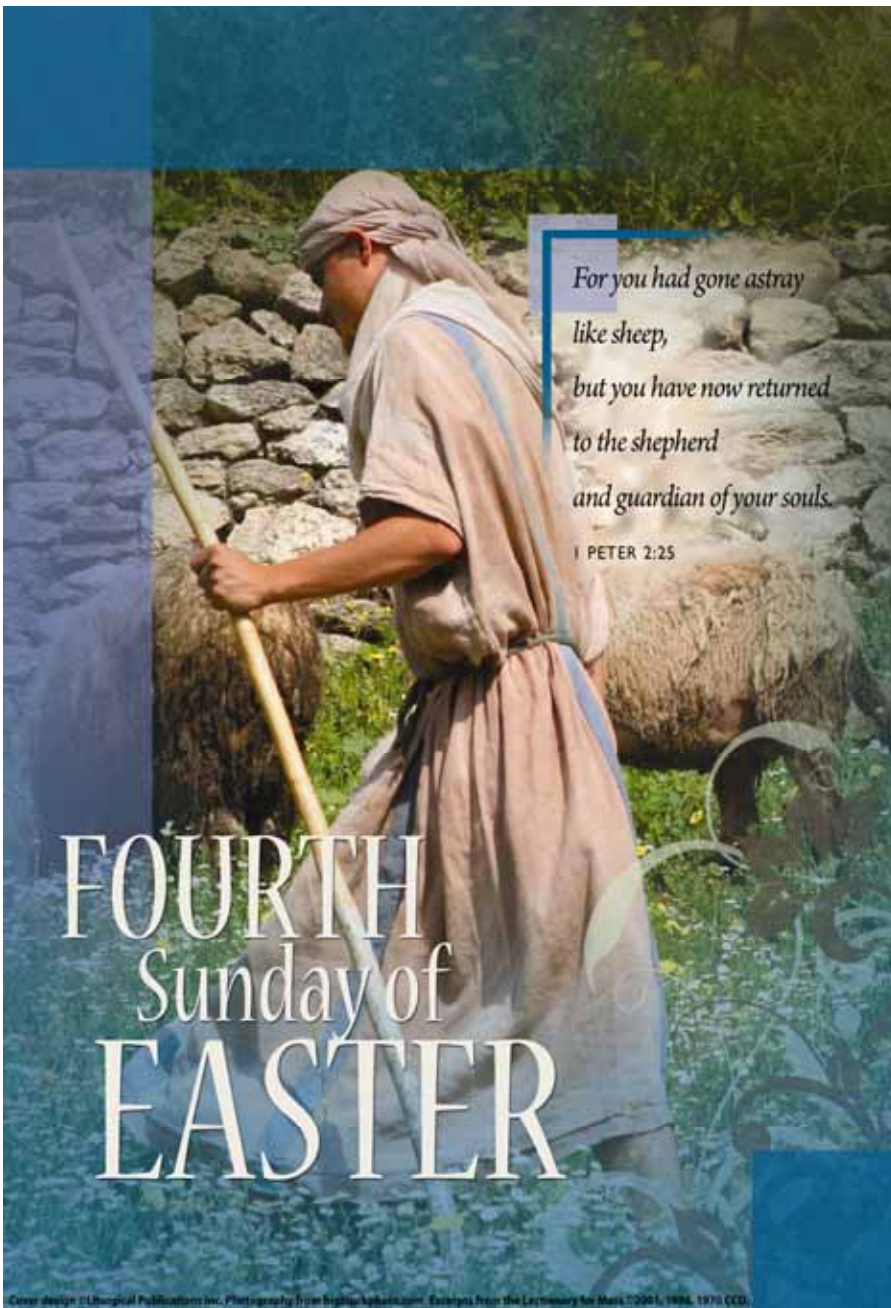
## Sacraments

**Baptisms:** The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month. Contact the parish office to pick up registration materials. Parents are required to attend one Baptismal preparation class.

**Marriage:** We celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage for only our registered parish members. Please phone the parish office one year in advance to schedule a meeting with the priest, before you book other arrangements.

**Anointing of the Sick/Pastoral Visits:** We are always willing to stop by your home or hospital. Please notify us when you or a family member is in need of a visit. The hospitals do not notify us. Anointing of the Sick will occur after every weekend Mass on the 2nd Sunday of each month.

**Reconciliation:** 1st and 3rd Saturdays at 3:30 pm before the 4:30 pm Mass and every 3rd Thursday following the 8:15 am Mass.

### A Message from Father Mark

In both the Gospel and the second reading from 1 Peter we have the rich imagery of the shepherd whose voice is recognized by his sheep. The use of the shepherd image dates back to the first and second centuries. Archeologists have discovered images of the shepherd carved upon the marble coffins of deceased Christians in the catacombs, especially near Rome. We are familiar with the illustration of the shepherd carrying a young lamb upon his shoulders and other artist renditions.

The depiction of Jesus as the shepherd holds an important truth for us: that we know the Lord's voice and that we follow Him. In Psalm 23, the Lord is described as our shepherd who leads us to streams of refreshment. He protects us with his rod and staff in hand to keep us from harm. As we travel through the dark valleys of life the shepherd is always there to watch over us. It is we who wander away from Him and follow the false voices and vain dreams and hopes of our society. To listen to false voices only leads us away from the truth that we know so well. In the Gospel, the ones who climb over the gate are thieves and robbers trying to snatch the unsuspecting from the flock. Those who came before Jesus were thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to their voices. The sheep knew the true voice. We know the true voice as well.

How do we keep from following false voices? We need to be honest with ourselves about the truths we know. St. Peter reminded his listeners in the first reading that they need to repent from their sins. We need the same reminder. When we wander away from the truth, our consciences formed by the grace of the Holy Spirit remind us that we are not following in the right path. Repentance of sin helps us acknowledge who is guiding us to the right paths so we are renewed and refreshed. It is the Lord's voice that needs to be clear in our lives. We know Jesus and we know what he offers us - eternal life.

As we continue our Easter journey, let the Lord's voice be heard clearly. In our second reading, St Peter concludes by stating that it is by the wounds of Jesus that we are healed. For when we go astray like sheep, we are always welcomed back by the shepherd of souls to remain in him forever. Let us attune our hearts to this true voice.

A wonderful event coming up is the Vine and Stein. This extraordinary social is meant to gather friends and enjoy an evening together in the parish. It is being sponsored by the Parish Council. Please bring friends, coworkers, relatives, and neighbors. Tickets can be purchased after Masses, the parish office, and at the door. **Free Clinic**

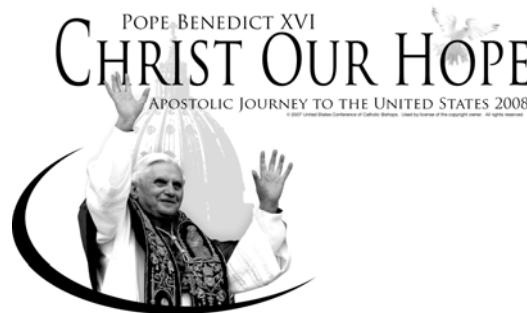

**Papal Visit 2008 April 15 –20**

The trip is historic, especially since the Holy Father will address the United Nations General Assembly, meet with President George Bush and visit Ground Zero. There will be several public events during the visit, including Mass at Nationals Park in Washington and Yankee Stadium in New York.

One new item that will be introduced next year is the concept of service hour requirements. Our students in grades 2 through 7 will be required to perform a set amount of service hours. This service will be a part of their 4<sup>th</sup> quarter Religion grade. ## Sharing Faith with Your Child

Each week, we offer parents a faith theme and how to weave it into ordinary family life. Ideas come from 52 Simple Ways to Talk with Your Kids about Faith by Jim Campbell. This week we consider **Developing Childhood Heroes**. Our heroes help us to form our consciences. These people helped form your idea of right and wrong. The first heroes of most children are the parents. Then heroes can come from people our children know through school or church, relatives, neighbors or other adults. They can also come through the media, books, games, and television. Take the time to talk with your children about your childhood heroes and what it was about the hero that was so important. Ask your child who they see as a hero and why. Read stories to your child which contain characters who make good moral choices.

## Maximilian: Saint of Auschwitz

An original one-man dramatization will be presented at Aquinas Academy in Menomonee Falls on Friday, April 25, and Saturday, April 26, at 7:00 pm.

In this inspiring professional program, actor and director of the motion picture THÉRÈSE, Leonardo Defilippis brings to life the heroic story of *Maximilian Kolbe*, "the saint of our difficult age", as Pope John Paul II calls him.
