## Sacraments

**Baptisms:** The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month. Contact the parish office to pick up registration materials. Parents are required to attend one Baptismal preparation class.

**Marriage:** We celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage for only our registered parish members. Please phone the parish office one year in advance to schedule a meeting with the priest, before you book other arrangements.

**Anointing of the Sick/Pastoral Visits:** We are always willing to stop by your home or hospital. Please notify us when you or a family member is in need of a visit. The hospitals do not notify us. Anointing of the Sick will occur after every weekend Mass on the 2nd Sunday of each month.

**Reconciliation:** 1st and 3rd Saturdays at 3:30 pm before the 4:30 pm Mass and every 3rd Thursday following the 8:15 am Mass.

### A Message from Father Mark

What Jesus proclaims to us needs to be proclaimed from the housetops! Don't be afraid, fear no one who can kill you physically but fear the one who can kill your soul. For Christians who are Evangelical, the need to proclaim that Jesus is their Lord and Savior is their way of expressing that they found Jesus and that Jesus is the center of their lives. For the Mormons, they have a program in which they send their youth out to go door to door to increase their membership and gather others to their way of life. For Catholics we are more reserved about proclaiming our Faith. We live our Faith; we don't need to state that Jesus is our Lord and Savior, we know it! We don't believe we need to go door to door asking others to become Catholic. Do we?

In the gospel this weekend, Jesus calls us to proclaim what we hear into the open. Jesus asks us to acknowledge Him before others. How do we acknowledge Jesus before others? Do we live our faith in our work places, among our friends and family members, with our faith community? Do we encourage others to live lives that are gospel centered? Jesus reminds us that we need to fear the one who can destroy our souls. I hear so often that my faith is very "personal and private." "I don't need to convince others to become Catholic." It is true that our faith lives have a personal and private aspect to them. But then we come back to the challenge of our gospel for today: how do we proclaim the message of the gospel to others in our lives? A suggestion might be that we become more attentive to what language we use with others around us. We need to treat others with respect even when we have differing opinions or beliefs. How judgmental are we towards others? How do we talk about others to their face but then change it behind their backs? We may not proclaim Jesus as our Lord and Savior or go door to door inviting others to become members of our community, but we do live among many people who know that we are Catholics. Would we be proud of the way we live our Catholic Faith? Take some time this week to consider how we proclaim the gospel to others and live that gospel for others.

Every year around this time the Festival Committee is working hard to enlist volunteers to help us fill all the needed spots. Please help us by making a personal commitment to the parish by signing up early for a particular area. Your personal commitment helps the volunteer coordinator know what areas need attention and what areas are covered. Every year the coordinator finds it challenging when there are many spots that need to be filled and the deadline is getting closer to the festival. Please we need your help to make this our 49<sup>th</sup> festival a success.

A word of thanks to all of you in regard to my being away from the parish during this time. I was asked by some dear student friends of mine to celebrate a wedding in Tuscany for them so I was honored to oblige. This time was really needed and certainly appreciated. I am certainly aware that I miss certain events which cause some parishioners to feel a bit sad. I am sorry about this but I have discovered that sometimes there is no perfect time. #### Trustee-Secretary Election

Every two years parish Bylaws require that trustees be elected by the parish to serve until their successors are elected. The Trustee-Secretary position is open this year. Therefore, please nominate anyone (including yourself) you think will be a good fit for this position. It is a two (2) year commitment.

To be placed in nomination, one has to be nominated in writing by 10 adult members of the congregation. The Nomination Forms are located at the end of each pew (parish members 18 years and older are eligible to nominate and vote). Nominations will close **Sunday, June 29, 2008**. You may either mail-in or give your Nomination Form to Fr. Mark or the Ushers after each Mass.

Candidate requirements:

- Catholic
- A registered and practicing parish member
- At least 25 years of age

The rules governing election of parish trustees come from Wisconsin State Statute 187.9 that stipulates: trustees are to be elected "from and by the congregation."
