## Sacraments

**Baptisms:** The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the first and third Sundays of the month. Contact the parish office to pick up registration materials. Parents are required to attend one Baptismal preparation class.

**Marriage:** We celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage for only our registered parish members. Please phone the parish office one year in advance to schedule a meeting with the priest, before you book other arrangements.

**Anointing of the Sick/Pastoral Visits:** We are always willing to stop by your home or hospital. Please notify us when you or a family member is in need of a visit. The hospitals do not notify us. Anointing of the Sick will occur after every weekend Mass on the 2nd Sunday of each month.

**Reconciliation:** 1st and 3rd Saturdays at 3:30 pm before the 4:30 pm Mass and every 3rd Thursday following the 8:15 am Mass.

## Dear Parishioners,

The “Faith in Our Future” Capital Campaign Team for St. Veronica is now in place. You may have heard that the Archdiocese of Milwaukee is engaged in a Capital Campaign to raise \$105 million dollars to strengthen parishes, schools and lifelong faith formation efforts throughout the diocese. This is a three (3) year campaign in which 60% of the funds raised will be used toward our parish goal and 40% will fund archdiocesan ministries. We live in a world that is changing constantly, that is full of uncertainty, and is weighed down with hopelessness. This campaign is centered and rooted in prayer and faith in Jesus Christ. You might be thinking, “What is expected from us?” As the campaign gets underway and further information is distributed, please pray. Prayer is the most essential element in the campaign. Pray for openness to the information presented. Pray for a strengthening of faith as we move through a financially unsettled time. Pray for the leadership team as we advance through the process, that we will hear what is important to you and for the archdiocese. Pray for insight about what God will be asking of you.

Faith In Our Future is about our future. The parishioners who established St. Veronica in the Depression era certainly faced challenges, hardships and controversies. We now reap the benefits from their sacrifices. Let us forge ahead towards a bright future, building upon what our predecessors started. In the upcoming months, information packets will be distributed to each family of the parish so you will know the goal and how we will achieve our goal. There will be activities in which you may be asked to participate thereby helping us meet our goal. Our children will be asked to participate in activities which will help them see the importance of the parish and the future of which they are a part.

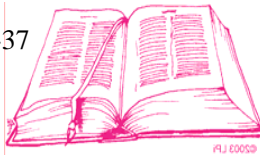

This helps them to remember to be more generous to the poor. They also read their holy book called the Qur'an.
