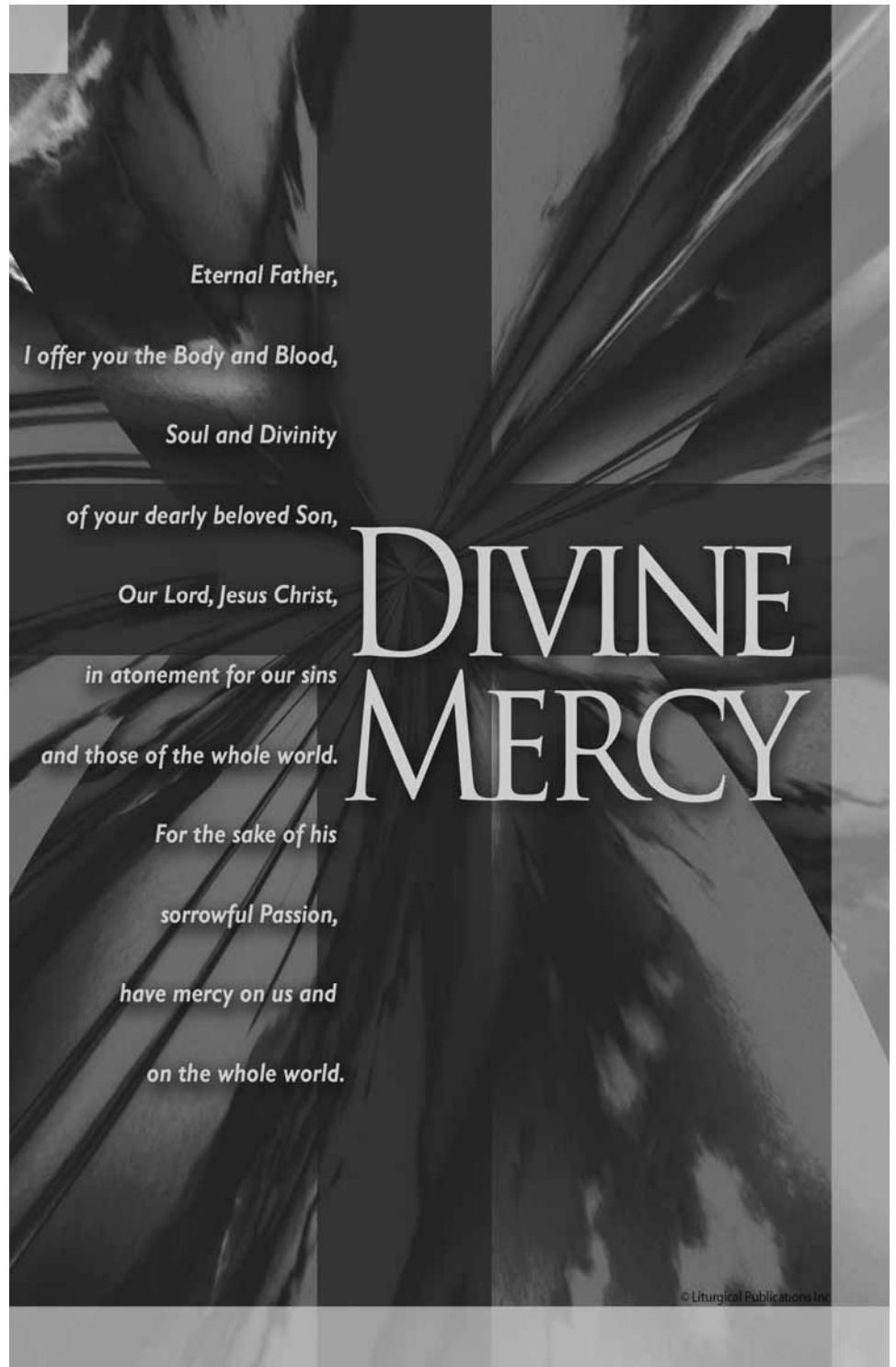

Dear Parishioners,

Since the Easter Vigil, we have been reading witness accounts that underscore the resurrection of Christ. This Sunday's gospel contains one of the accounts of the resurrection as the Lord goes to great lengths to convince a skeptical apostle. While it was expected of Jesus' adversaries to question his resurrection, no one expected an apostle to be a skeptic. However, Thomas' doubt gave the apostles another opportunity to host the Lord, and brought blessings to those who did not see but believed (John 20:29).

Though Thomas earned a negative reputation as the "doubting Thomas," he was not lacking in virtues. He showed great courage and loyalty when the other apostles were discouraging Jesus from going to Bethany for the raising of Lazarus, due to the danger posed by those who earlier wanted to stone him (John 11:8). Thomas said, "Let us also go that we may die with him." (John. 11:16). He also asked Jesus one of the most famous questions in the New Testament: "Lord, we do not know where you are going, how can we know the way?" Jesus responded, "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." (John 14:5-6).

One might wonder why Thomas would doubt the reality of the resurrection given that Jesus' predictions of his suffering and death had already come true. We know that the predictions of his resurrection were tied to predictions of his suffering and death. Moreover, the raising of Lazarus gave ample evidence of God's power to raise the dead, coupled with Jesus' assertion that he was the resurrection and the life (John 11:25). It is conceivable that Thomas' doubt was a yearning for personal encounter with the risen Lord. Nonetheless, he received a mild rebuke for putting a lot of emphasis on the empirical method. Faith is not based on science or scientific proof, but on trust in God.

Christian apologists refer to 2Cor 10:5 and 1Peter 3:5 for their right to defend the faith against attacks and ridicule. In his book, "The Resurrection of the Son of God," N.T. Wright states: "We are to be prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks for a reason for the hope that is in us." (p. 715). The problem is that we are faced with a secular world that seems to deny anything supernatural, and whose epistemology is strictly empirical. In all likelihood, we have come across people who just would not believe what Christ and his Church teach. Of course, there are degrees of skeptics. Some are skeptics for the sake of being skeptical, while others are skeptics because they simply have not been presented with compelling evidence.

Rick Gerhardt in his article "What 'Doubting' Thomas tells us about Faith and Reason," states that Jesus gently rebuked Thomas, not because Thomas wanted evidence, but because he expected an extraordinary amount of evidence. What was given him, including the testimony of the other disciples should have been sufficient to support his faith. Wright and Gerhardt agree that one way to break down barriers is by objectively presenting to the secular world the underlying historical evidence for our faith.

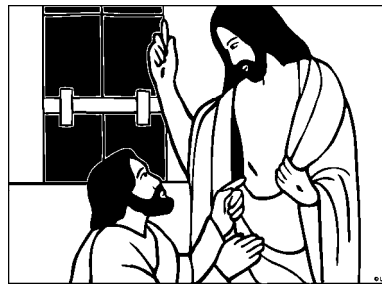
Benediction

Lectionary Link: Breaking Open the Word of God

This week we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter. The church also calls this Divine Mercy Sunday. In the first Reading we will begin to hear about the activities of the early church as recounted by Luke in the book of Acts. In the Gospel we learn that belief in the Resurrection was not necessarily easy. The apostle Thomas needed to physically touch the wounds of Christ before he could believe. Jesus allows him to put his hands on the wounds but then proclaims Good News for all of us – "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed!" We, the church of the 21st century are blessed.

Second Sunday of Easter

Today is the octave of Easter, the eighth day of the Resurrection of Christ. Recall that the "Eighth Day" was an image used by the early Church to speak about the eternal day that Christ will establish when he returns in glory at the end of time.

It is this image from early Christianity that the Church uses to talk about Easter and the Resurrection. In our celebration of the Paschal Mystery, we experience a foretaste of that final day on which God's great love will establish his kingdom forever.

In the context of this day and its celebration, our late Holy Father Pope John Paul II called the Church to remember the Divine Mercy of God through which Christ was raised from the dead. *Divine Mercy Sunday*, then, reminds us that it is because of God's great, eternal mercy that He has promised a day of new creation, a final forever Sunday. It is a day in which his divine mercy will wipe away, forever, all sin, all suffering, all sadness, all illness. As a celebration of Easter, John Paul reminds us that this day recalls God's great love, which is stronger than sin and death.

The Resurrection of Christ is the very miracle of mercy that has forever changed our destiny as God's sons and daughters. In Easter joy we recall that great miracle and its promise to us. In this celebration, we go forth "loving God, and loving one's neighbor and even one's enemies," after Jesus' example. (Homily of Pope John Paul II on the Second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday, 2001)

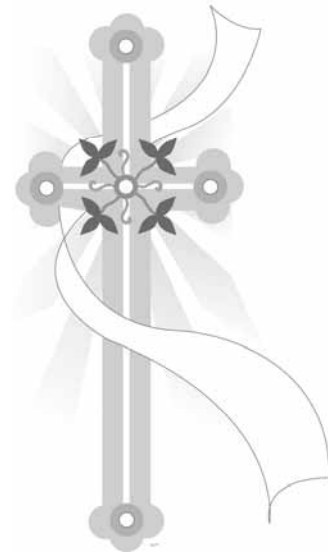
