The water we blessed was also used in vases with forsythia branches that blossomed over the vacation. We ended with a renewal of our Baptismal Promises and a jellybean prayer. Students went back to their rooms and worked on a craft project. Some of these projects went home with students and others went to the home bound and nursing home parishioners. We ended the day with prayer.
