Fun Facts for Faithful Kids

Feb 12 is Abraham Lincoln's birthday. He was President during the Civil War which kept our country as the United States of America, instead of

being split into two separate countries. President Lincoln was also famous for being very honest. Would your friends call you honest?

Have you ever heard of Bishop Fulton Sheen? Bishop Sheen started a television program on February 12, 1952 called "Life is Worth Living". It became very popular. It was so popular that Bishop Sheen was nominated for an Emmy

award for Most Outstanding Television Personality. His competition was Lucille Ball, Jimmy Durante, and Edward R. Murrow. Bishop Sheen won the award.



February 14 is the feast of a saint that we know very little about. According to tradition, St. Valentine was a priest of Rome during a time when it was illegal for

men and women to marry. St. Valentine secretly performed marriages until he was arrested. He was condemned to death by the Prefect of Rome. While awaiting his punishment, St. Valentine was visited by the daughter of the prison guard and they became friends. When Valentine was taken away to be killed, he wrote a note thanking the girl for her friendship and signed it "Love from your Valentine." Valentine is the patron saint of engaged couples and happy marriages.

February 14 is also the feast of Sts. Cyril and Methodius. These two priests and brothers were sent by the Pope to convert the Moravians (Slavs). There was no alphabet for the Slavonic language so Cyril helped to develop the alphabet. This alphabet is still known as the Cyrillic alphabet.
