Dear Parishioners,

As Deacon Chalhoub informed you last week, the Archdiocese has asked me to serve as Temporary Administrator of St. Veronica while Fr. Mark is on sabbatical. This is in addition to my present ministry as Administrator of your neighboring parish, St. Paul. I feel honored and excited to be asked to serve you in this capacity these next three months. If you need to read a little more about me, you could visit the St. Paul website at: www.stpaulmilwaukee.org.

According to our Archdiocesan Clergy Manual, the Temporary Administrator of a parish is a priest who steps in to care for a parish when a pastor dies or is incapacitated or has left office or is temporarily absent due to illness, being on sabbatical, etc. The manual further states that the Temporary Administrator has the same rights and obligations as a pastor, but is not to make major changes that would adversely affect the parish. Certainly, I have no intentions of making major changes in the parish, but would strive with the cooperation of the staff, the trustees, and the parish council, to maintain the *status quo* until Fr. Mark returns from sabbatical.

I am encouraged by the level of on-going collaboration between St. Veronica and St. Paul. As you know, we are already sharing two staff positions: Karen Bushman is the Director of Religious Formation for the two parishes, and Jeff Montoya is the Youth Minister for both parishes. We are also collaborating with four other parishes in our cluster in running and maintaining St. Thomas Aquinas Academy.

On account of my liturgical responsibilities at St. Paul, I am unable to join you for the weekend and weekday liturgies. Nonetheless, please know that I am with you in spirit during these liturgical celebrations. Thanks to Fr. Thomas LeMieux, Fr. Joseph Lubrano, and other help-out priests, for their willingness to assist with our weekday and weekend liturgical celebrations. As you welcome me, I also urge you to welcome them and enable them to minister to you effectively.

As you know, Lent begins this Wednesday with the celebration of Ash Wednesday. Lent is our forty-day period of preparation for the celebration of Easter. Our forty days of preparation is connected to the forty days of prayer observed by Moses, Elijah, and most of all, Jesus Christ in the wilderness. The Council of Nicaea in 325 mentioned forty days of Easter preparation called *quadragesima*, which was observed in both the Eastern and Western Churches. The forty days of Lent are special days of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as we await the glory of the Lord's resurrection.

Lent is a time of conversion, when we strive to turn away from sin and embrace the abundant graces revealed and manifested in Jesus of Nazareth. Hence, the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday is a stark reminder that we are humble and repentant sinners in need of God's forgiveness and the grace of redemption.

Lenten Regulations

February 21, Ash Wednesday, is the first day of the 2007 Lenten Season. The regulations pertaining to fast and abstinence are as follows: The Catholic Church ask each member to preserve the penitential character and purpose of Lent. For this reason:

- a. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and each Friday of Lent.
- b. Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday should abstain from meat as listed above, and should fast on Ash Wednesday, and Good Friday. On those days, they should eat only one full meal. Smaller quantities of food may be taken at two other meals, but no food should be consumed at other times on those two days. The obligation fasting ceases with the celebration of one's 59th birthday. Catholic should not lightly excuse themselves from these prescribed minimal penitential practices.

Rite of Sending and Rite of Election

St. Paul and St. Veronica parishes will celebrate the Rite of Sending and Rite of Election at the Masses next Sunday, February 25. Three boys from St. Veronica – *Parker Cottonero, Damian Krause, and Brandon Traner* will be sent from our community to the cathedral. Through the Rite of Sending, our parish is acknowledging the readiness of these children to receive the sacraments of initiation. The children will enroll their names in the book of the elect. The parish adult candidates who will be fully initiated into the Catholic Church through the sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist: *Sherril Schoen, Lisa Veselka, and Christopher Witkowski* will also be sent to the cathedral.

During the Rite of Election, the children and candidates will be called by name and recognized by the larger Catholic community. The Archbishop will declare that these catechumens and candidates are *the elect*, those chosen by God to celebrate the sacraments. The importance of this rite is the declaration that God's choice of these children is eternal. The six weeks of Lent will then become a period of intense preparation for the reception of the Sacraments of Initiation on Holy Saturday.

Each week during Lent, the bulletin will feature one of our six RCIA/RCIC participants. As a parish community we are asked to keep each of these adults and children in our prayers.
