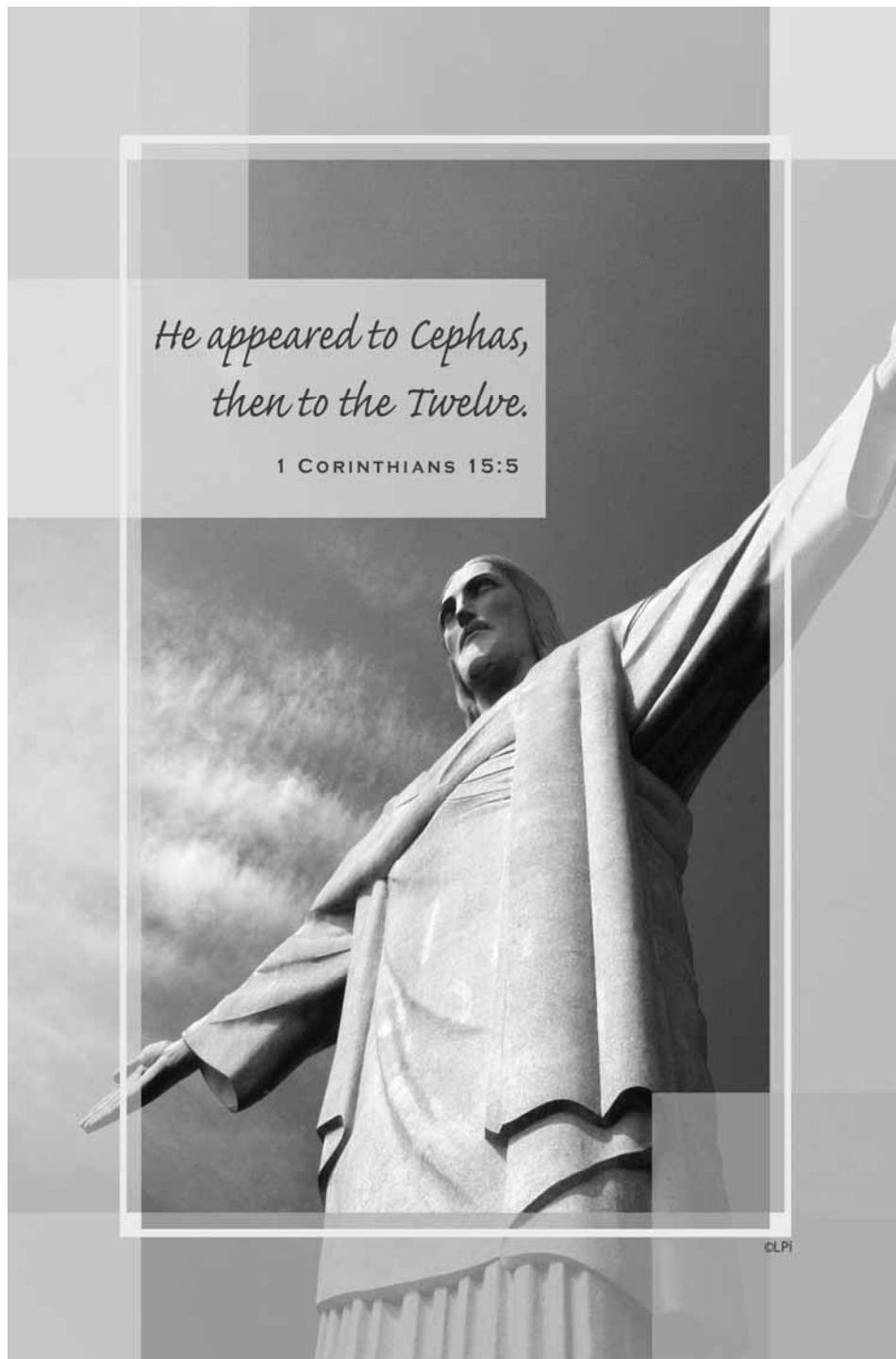

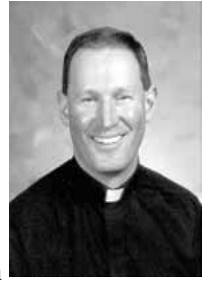

# A Message from Father Mark

Dear Parishioners,

Last weekend, we discussed that the priest shortage is at the heart of the difficulties in finding adequate coverage during my sabbatical. Due to an unforeseen and difficult situation at another parish, it was necessary that Fr. Paul Hartmann be placed at that parish rather than coming to St. Veronica. This begged the larger question: "In the next 5, 10, and 15 years, where will the Archdiocese find enough priests to staff all of the currently viable parishes?" The members of the largest seminary classes from the 1950's and 1960's are nearing retirement age. The classes that followed, those of the 70's, 80's and later had far fewer men. For example, in 1969, 26 men were ordained. To equal that number, you would need to add together all of the priests from the ordination classes of 1994-2006! This includes Fr. Hartmann and me. In some of those years, there was only one man ordained. That in itself is an eye opener.



Last week when parishioners were questioning the reason Fr. Paul was unable to join us, a mother of three boys stopped to chat. She reminded me that when we had so many priests the necessity to encourage a son to become a priest was not recognized. That made sense. The new reality might be a wakeup call to some parents to reconsider the idea. What are the qualities you appreciate in a priest and think about whether a son or other young man you know might possess these qualities. Then to discuss the subject with your son might help him recognize the small inner voice of the Holy Spirit inviting him to a beautiful and fulfilling life.

The vocations picture is not hopeless and we should not despair. Yet we as Catholics must also be realistic about the expectations which can be placed on the dwindling number of ordained. Are there creative ways to consider that would allow the Catholic faithful to continue being a sacramental church without stretching our priests too thin? Do we pray for vocations to the priesthood in our daily prayers? Is there more we can and should be doing?

The attendance at the farewell pancake breakfast last Sunday was overwhelming. Please accept my big THANK YOU for your prayers and well wishes as I journey to Japan. Parishioners have asked if I will be checking my email while in Japan. **I will not.** The idea of the sabbatical is to get away. My intention is to put a message on my email account reminding parishioners and others to contact another staff person in my absence until my return in May. Please remember that each one of you travels with me in my heart and that I will remember the parish when I offer Mass. Until we meet again, "May God hold you in the palm of His Hand and keep you all safe." *Blessings and Dewa mata (see you later), Fr. Mark*

## Article: Oppose the Death Penalty....continued from the 1/28 bulletin

The article from the January 27 and 28 bulletin discussed the problems with the death penalty – its irreversibility, wrongful executions, bias, error or unscrupulousness of law enforcement officials [lawyers, police and prosecutors...]. The article will now conclude.

### Doesn't DNA evidence now ensure that an innocent person will never be executed?

No. Though DNA provides one of the most accurate types of evidence, it is not foolproof. State crime labs have very little regulation. To date, there are still no federal guidelines that crime labs must follow in handling DNA evidence. Studies of several crime labs across the nation have found numerous examples of human error, from contaminated DNA tests, to false-positive matches and falsified results.

### But hasn't the Church supported the death penalty in the past?

Yes, the Church has traditionally taught that states have the right to impose the death penalty in order to protect their citizens, but this right has been carefully circumscribed.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* now states that if "non-lethal means are sufficient to defend and protect people's safety from the aggressor, authority will limit itself to such means, as these are more in keeping with the concrete conditions of the common good and more in conformity with the dignity of the human person." (#2267)

As the U.S. Bishops wrote recently in their 2005 statement, *A Culture of Life and the Penalty of Death*, Catholic teaching on the common good commits each of us to pursue the good of everyone and of society as a whole. When the state, in our names and with our taxes, ends a human life despite having non-lethal alternatives, it suggests that society can overcome violence with violence. The use of the death penalty ought to be abandoned not only for what it does to those who are executed, but for what it does to all of society."

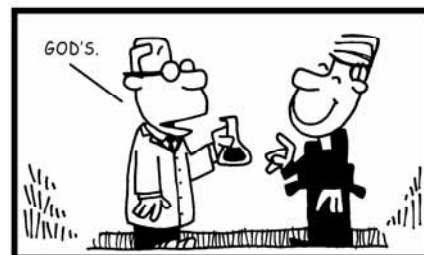
