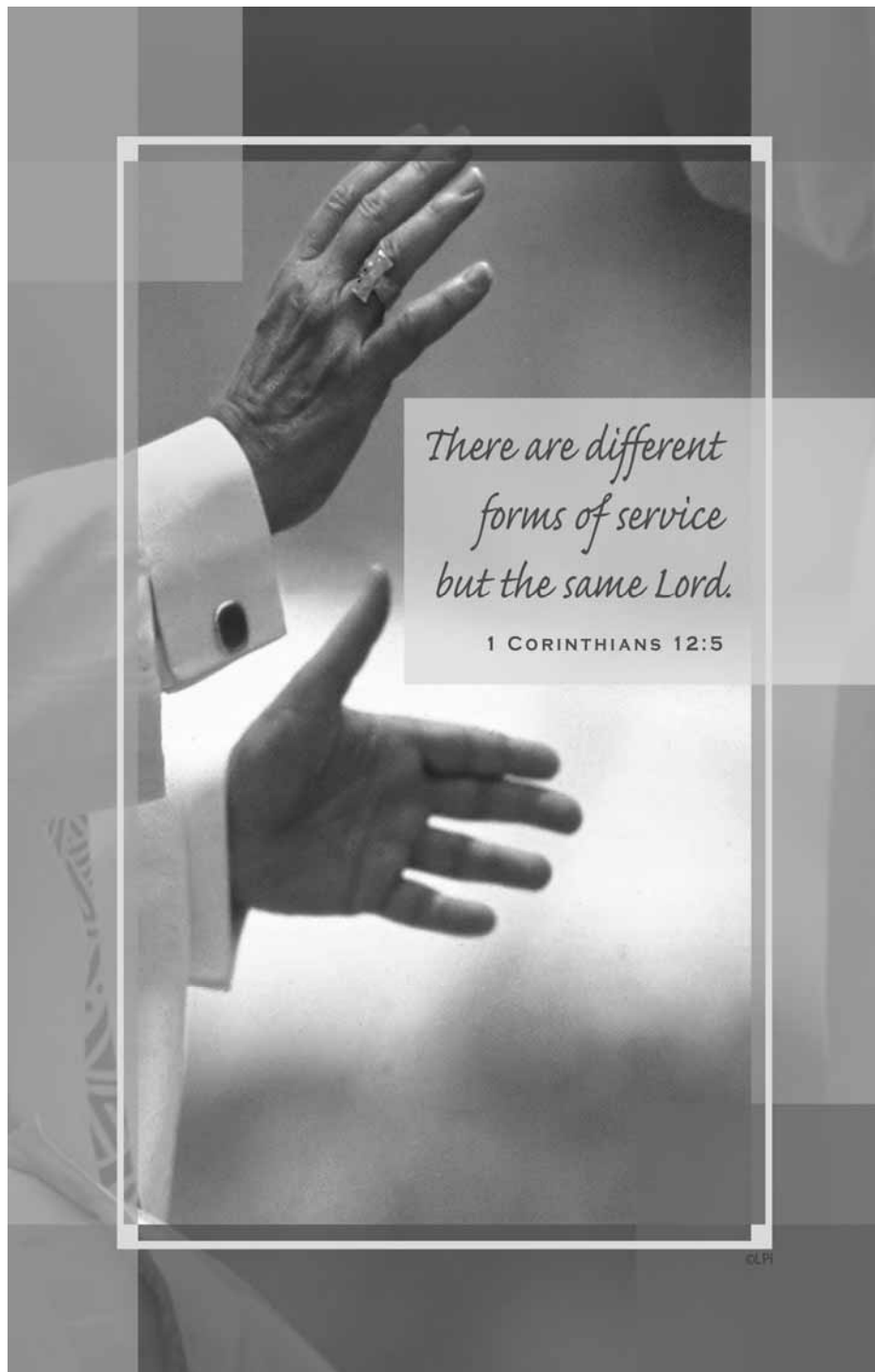

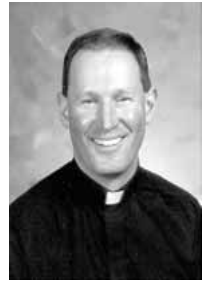

# A Message from Father Mark

## Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday, we return to Ordinary Time on the church calendar. After the beautiful décor of the Christmas season, the church almost seems barren. Yet it is also a time when we can let out the big *sigh* that the hectic busyness is over. We are all ready for a little ordinary.

Gratitude needs to be expressed to the members of the Environment Committee for the wonderful work that they did during the Christmas season. The church was beautiful. It seemed like a shame to take it all down. Special thanks to those who assisted in the take down, especially the teenagers. Remember the message from the Feast of the Holy Family. We need to involve our children through projects and programs to instill in them a deeper sense of church. It is important to attend Mass, but we need to be “totally” involved in our parish. Then, we can gradually see a sense of ownership and commitment to the community.



On the weekend of January 20-21, there will be a free presentation on funeral pre-arrangement provided by both Prasser Kleczka and Tyborski Funeral Homes. It will allow you to listen and ask questions about what is needed when planning a funeral. Too often, we simply push this idea of prearrangement to the side and tell ourselves, “We have time to do this later.” Well, guess what, “later”, comes sooner than you think. In fact, I recently put my affairs in order for when God decides it is time for me to come home. You can never start too early. This program will take place after each of the Masses on the Norwich side of the church. Funeral directors Jay Kleczka and Ken Tyborski will share their insights. The conversation about what to do at the time of death is important for both married couples and single adults. Discussing it now might eliminate some of the stress that occurs at the time of death, especially if it becomes a sudden loss. Please consider attending this meaningful presentation.

January 31<sup>st</sup> will be my final at the office until April 30<sup>th</sup>. My flight to Japan leaves on February 1<sup>st</sup>. Fr. Paul Hartmann, will be guiding the parish as the temporary administrator until my return. Do not listen to rumors circulating that I will not return. HOGWASH! ## Parish Spiritual Adoption Program For An Unborn Child

Next weekend, January 20 and 21, is the sign-up for the 2007

Spiritual Adoption Program. Last year, 188 individuals and families from St. Veronica participated in this special program of prayer. Your response was amazing! This year we hope you will sign-up again and that even more parishioners will join us in prayer for unborn children. Families and people of all ages can participate.

Here is how the program works: Participants in the Spiritual Adoption Program pledge to pray for nine months for a baby in danger of abortion. While this child will remain unknown to his or her spiritual parent, God knows this child. Many people have found that naming "their child" helps keep them focused on the reality that their prayers are helping to save a particular baby from the danger of abortion and give the baby the humanity that he or she deserves.

The prayer is simple and needs to be said every day for nine months:

*Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted, who is in danger of abortion.* (Prayer of Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen, Founder of Spiritual Adoption Program)

The emphasis of the program is on prayer and education concerning the sanctity of life. Participants will receive a prayer card, a pamphlet to follow their baby's development over the nine months, and a pin to wear in honor of the child for whom they pray. Next October, a baby shower will be held at the conclusion of the nine months of prayer with collected items being donated to local crisis pregnancy centers which offer alternatives to abortion

There are millions of unborn babies desperately in need of your prayers. Please consider spiritually adopting a baby and share the love for life that God has given you. *The Respect Life Committee*

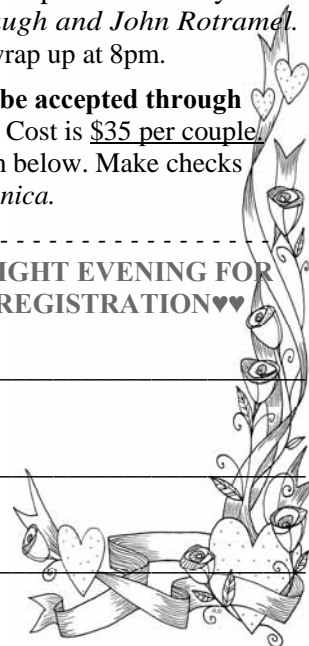
