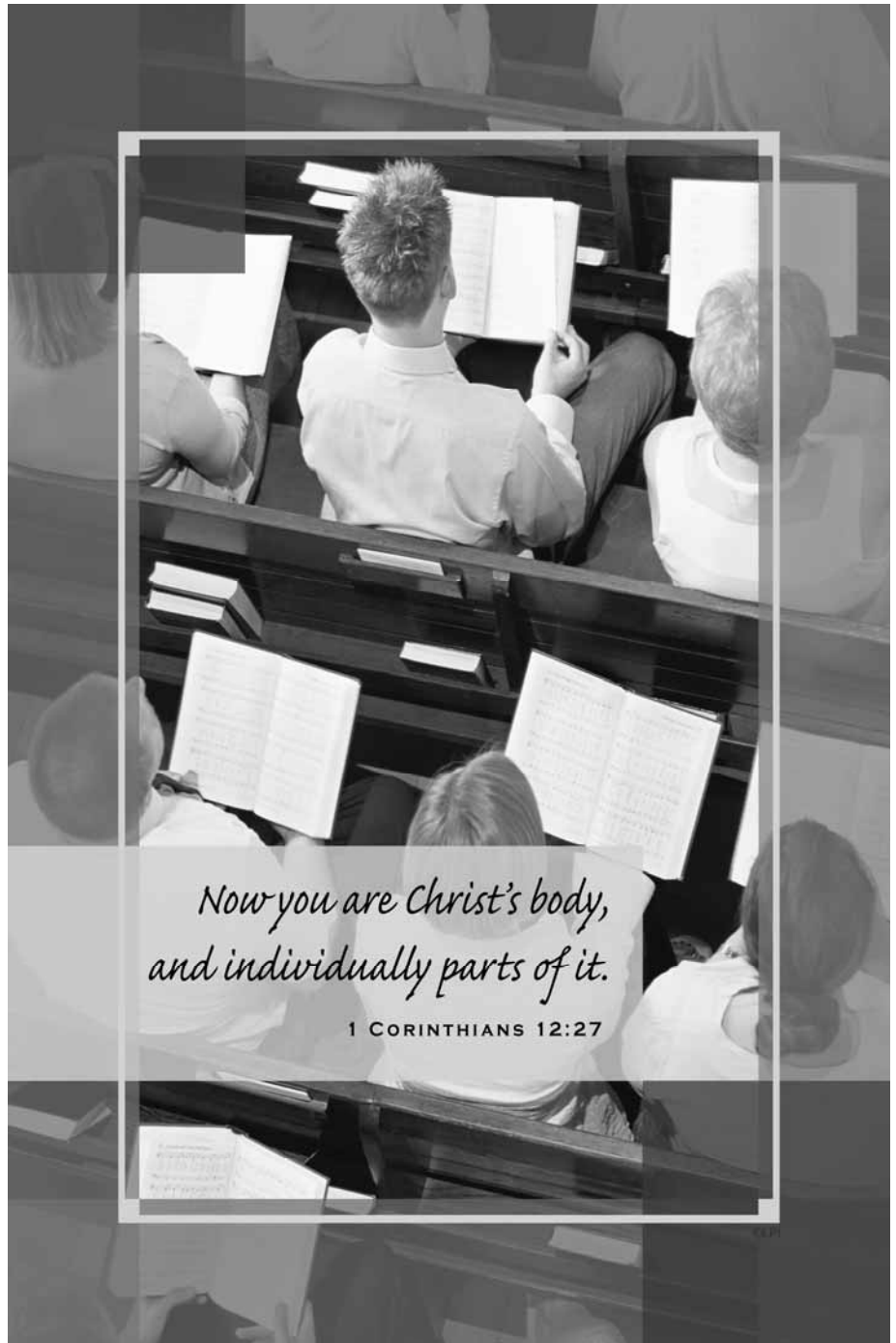

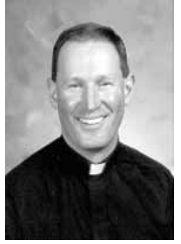

A Message from Father Mark

Dear Parishioners,

The movement of the Spirit is certainly alive in our community. The Gospel Reading for this weekend speaks to me as preparations for the sabbatical continue. Sr. Beatrice, my contact in Japan, has informed me that the details of my journey are now complete. This experience is certainly going to be an opportunity that will only come once in my lifetime.



My guide, a Buddhist priest named Mr. Sugo, is an extraordinary man. He has worked and lived in the temple in Kyoto for 40 years. He has worked closely with novices of the School Sisters of Notre Dame when they first arrive in Japan by helping them to understand the Japanese culture especially Buddhism which very much a part of Japan. This may sound strange, but most of my time in the temple will be spent barefooted. I will be fully immersed in the daily life of the monastery: learning what is typical of Japanese culture including the preparation of the gardens for the spring. All of my experiences will be shared with you upon my return.

Please remember that the pastor alone doesn't make the St. Veronica community - you do! Please do not be afraid to ask the priest who is coming in if help is needed, especially if he looks a bit confused. It takes a bit of time to learn how to preach and preside in our parish church. Be encouraging and supportive. I certainly know how helpful all of you have been for me. Please reach out to our visiting priests; it leaves a very good impression about our community. Thank you.

A heartfelt thank you needs to be extended to Patrick Urban who has devoted himself to our parish and school as our webmaster. We would not have the quality site without his artistic hand and clever ideas. However, Patrick is unable to continue in this position. Parish Spiritual Adoption Program For An Unborn Child

This weekend is the sign up for the 2007 Spiritual Adoption Program. Last year, 188 individuals and families from St. Veronica participated in this special program of prayer. Families and people of all ages can participate.

Here is how the program works:

Participants in the Spiritual Adoption Program pledge to pray for nine months for a baby in danger of abortion. While this child will remain unknown to his or her spiritual parent, God knows this child. Many people have found that naming "their child" helps keep them focused on the reality that their prayers are helping to save a particular baby from the danger of abortion and give the baby the humanity that he or she deserves.

The prayer is simple and needs to be said every day for nine months:

Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, I love you very much. I beg you to spare the life of the unborn baby that I have spiritually adopted, who is in danger of abortion. (Prayer of Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen, Founder of Spiritual Adoption Program)

The emphasis of the program is on prayer and education concerning the sanctity of life. Participants will receive a prayer card, a pamphlet to follow their baby's development over the nine months, and a pin to wear in honor of the child for whom they pray. Next October, a baby shower will be held at the conclusion of the nine months of prayer with collected items being donated to local crisis pregnancy centers which offer alternatives to abortion

There are millions of unborn babies desperately in need of your prayers. Please consider spiritually adopting a baby and share the love for life that God has given you. *The Respect Life Committee*

Fun Facts for Faithful Kids

Would you like to be a doctor when you get older? On January 23, 1849, Elizabeth Blackwell became the first American woman to receive a degree as a doctor. She said, "It shall be the effort of my life, by God's blessing, to shed honor on this diploma." All work is important, even the work we do at home for mom and dad. So every day we must ask God to bless everything we do.

January 24 is the feast of the Patron Saint of the Archdiocese of Milwaukee. His name is St. Francis de Sales. St. Francis was a famous teacher, writer, and preacher. He often said: "You can catch more flies with a spoonful of honey than with a hundred barrels of vinegar." That means you can make more friends by being kind than by demanding that they be your friend.

Is your name Timothy? If so, you share a Namesday with Archbishop Timothy Dolan on January 26. St. Timothy was a friend of St. Paul. When St. Paul was planning to visit a city, St. Timothy would be his messenger and announce St. Paul's visit. After St. Paul would leave, Timothy would sometimes stay behind to make sure the community was settled before he left.
