your Father. Amen.

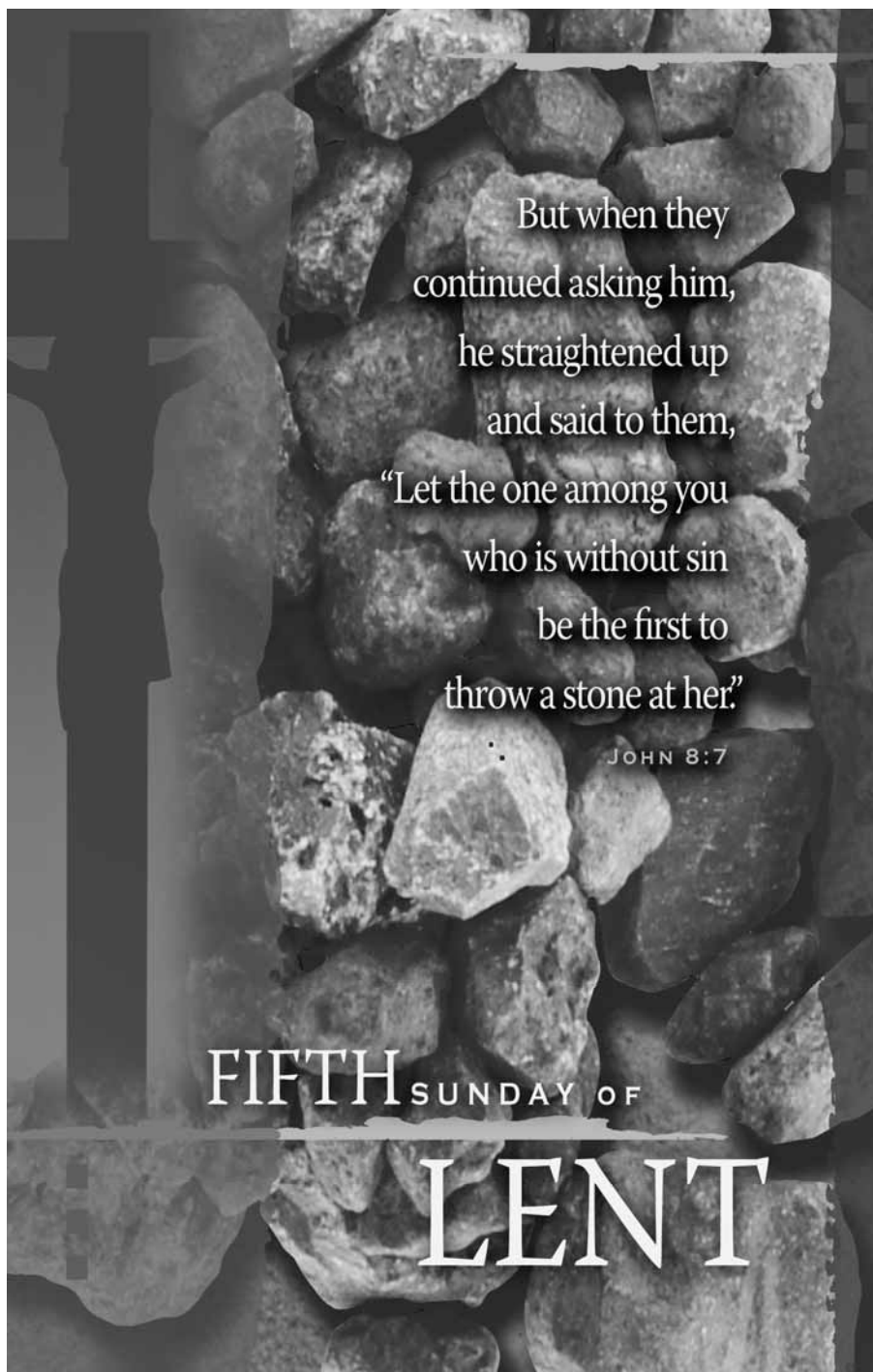

### From the Desk of Youth Minister, Jeff Montoya

The topic of our youth ministry curriculum for March was "The Last Things" or more simply, death. As part of our session, the students read obituaries and were asked to discuss what their own obituary might be like: what contributions might they have made in the world in which they lived. It was somewhat surprising that most of the students found it very difficult to think about their deaths or didn't know if they ever had faced the issue before. This is a great exercise for all of us to consider.

Our Lenten readings this Sunday bring us face-to-face with death. The pervasive image, however, is not sadness or loss but resurrection and new life. It is no accident that we hear these readings in the spring when the signs of the death of winter – barren trees, snow banks and brown grass are getting ready to give way to the new life of springtime – green grass, buds and flowers. Speaking of which, we will be doing some work around the grounds of the parish soon and we will need lots of volunteers to help. Anyone who is interested is asked to contact the parish maintenance engineer, Mike Stahler.

Just as the new life of spring unfolds, so does our ultimate destiny. Our deaths are but a transition to life eternal. Not like Lazarus who will die again, but like Christ who lives forever. As we continue on our Lenten journey, take up the challenge to reflect on your own death. What contributions you will leave to this world and how will that send you on your way to your eternal reward?

**Operation Rice Bowl – 5th Week of Lent**  
*The story below is of one family being assisted by Operation Rice Bowl. Cambodia is one of the 2007 Catholic Relief Services sponsored countries.*

### A Story From Cambodia

My name is *Ek Sakhorn*, and I live in a village called Samaky in Cambodia, which is near the border with Vietnam. I am a farmer and have a wife and three children. For years, my farm did not do very well. I could grow only enough food to feed my family and did not have any extra crops to sell at the market. Without money, I could not pay for my children to go to school or buy medicines to treat my wife's illness. We were barely getting by.

With the help of Santi Sena, a local agriculture group that works with Catholic Relief Services, I learned how to improve my farm. I built a fish pond, pigpens and a vegetable garden, and now I produce a variety of things to sell at the market. I also received a small grant from CRS to build a tree nursery where I grow fruit-tree seedlings to sell to other farmers.

My farm is now thriving and we have enough money to pay for food and clothes for my family and school for my children. We also built a new home which is on stilts so it won't flood during the rainy season. My wife is receiving treatment for her illness and now is well enough to help me with the farm. We are planning to start a new business soon near a new factory being built in our village. We will sell food to the workers and build a new building that they can rent for lodging. I look forward to the future which continues to get brighter for me, my wife and our children.
