your Father. Amen.



Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday's gospel about Jesus' transfiguration may come as a surprise to many who are inclined to see it as being out of tune with the Lenten season. There seems to be a big chasm between the somber mood of Lent and the glorious mood of the transfiguration narrative. As contradictory as this might seem, it helps to focus attention on the light at the end of the tunnel. George Foreman, former world heavyweight boxing champion once stated that what kept him motivated during his boxing career was keeping his eyes on the prize; the championship belt, and perhaps the zillions of dollars that come with it. Thinking about the glory and success that comes with victory helps to ameliorate the pain and suffering associated with the preparation process.

For us Christians, Lent calls for intense preparation as part of our journey to the glory of Easter. The readings of Lent remind us to re-focus attention on our relationship with God and neighbor. During Lent, we are challenged to renew our commitment to prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. The transfiguration story enables us to keep our eyes on the prize associated with the Lenten season. Of course, that prize is the glory and joy of Jesus' resurrection on Easter Sunday. In a real sense, we are like people on a race, and cannot stop until we have reached the finish line.

One might argue that we just got started on the Lenten journey, therefore, it is too early to start losing focus. That would be a great point, but see what happened to the First Sunday of Lent – a winter blizzard that led to the cancellation of services and very low attendance for the few churches that were open. Though the blizzard was not as severe in some places as predicted, it was severe enough to disrupt the First Sunday in Lent. Obviously, it is always better to be safe than sorry. Nevertheless, it feels like some steam was prematurely let out of our Lenten cooker that started on Ash Wednesday. Certainly, the Church had no premonitions of a winter blizzard when our transfiguration gospel was selected. The transfiguration story re-focuses our attention by showing us a glimpse of the light at the end of the tunnel. Inasmuch as the gospel reveals the upcoming glory of the Easter Resurrection, it also reveals the eschatological glory that awaits us in God's kingdom.

Moments of theophany in the gospels are always special moments of glory. By the way, theophanies are those moments in the scripture when the heavens open up, and one hears the voice of God speaking. At Jesus' baptism, God stated: "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased." (Luke 3:22). In our Sunday gospel God states: "This is my chosen Son; listen to him." (Luke 9:35). Whereas the first theophany was addressed to Jesus, the second was addressed to the world. It is important to note that when God spoke, the disciples fell silent. Hence, if we mean to listen to Jesus this Lent, we need to be still, be silent, and hear what God is saying to us as individuals, and as a community. We cannot afford to be talking when God is talking, or else, we miss the point.

Fun Facts for Faithful Kids

Do you know what a **lavabo** is? Lavabo means “washing of your hands.” After the gifts of bread and wine have been brought forward to the priest, a server pours water over the priest’s fingers and then gives him a purificator to dry them. This ritual comes from a time when people who did not have any money, so they would offer animals, grain or other crops during the offertory. Then the priest needed to have clean hands before the Consecration. Today, the lavabo is a symbol of the need to be pure before the Consecration. Do you get “cleaned up” before coming to Mass?

March 4-10 is “Celebrate Your Name Week.” God calls each of us by name. We are each special to God. Do you know what your name means or your baptismal name? Why not spend some time with mom or dad getting to know more about your name.
